

Dear Farmer/Rancher:

The United States Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) has a variety of programs available to help you with environmental concerns that may exist on your owned or leased agricultural properties. Our staff can help you with technical and financial assistance (cost-share grants).

We have a variety of easement programs to protect farmland, grazing lands and wetlands from development or destruction. We have listed several options available through our cost-share programs.

We also have the **Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)** which is designed to help those who are good stewards of the land and need a little more assistance to get their farm to a higher level of management or environmental protection.

- **Spill Prevention (of fuels and oil):** Develop a plan to contain any potential spills. After the plan is completed and approved, an application can be submitted to install needed practices.
- **Air Quality:** Practices such as replacement of old engines with new Tier 4, non-road diesel engines, windbreaks, magnesium chloride on dusty roads, etc.
- **Energy Audit:** Receive an audit on your farm to see where energy improvements could be made.
- **High Tunnels:** These are simple green houses that are un-heated and un-automated.
- **Organics:** Converting to an organic system or needing further assistance to meet the requirements to maintain a certified organic status.
- **Orchards & Vineyards:** Specialty crops have unique pesticide management and irrigation needs.
- **Forestry:** Funding is available to implement forestry practices.
- **Sage Grouse & Prairie Dogs:** To keep these animals off of the endangered species list, special consideration is being given to help improve their habitat.
- **Wildlife:** Assistance for a wide variety of wildlife enhancements.
- **Stream Restorations:** Improvements to stream banks to stop or prevent erosion and improve wildlife habitat.
- **Wetland Restoration:** We have a variety of options to restore and protect wetlands.
- **Grazing Improvements:** Watering facilities for livestock, reseeding, cross fences (not boundaries), etc.
- **Irrigation Improvements:** Conversions to higher efficiency sprinkler systems, land leveling.
- **Manure Storage & Application:** If you have livestock concentrated in a feed lot, funding is available to contain the manure and prevent it from entering waters of the state of Utah.
